- Parents will be notified of school events in a timely, efficient manner by a variety of means including web postings, e-mail, phone calls, flyers and traditional mailings.
- MTHS will provide a centralized parent resource center.
- Training sessions/workshops on diverse topics will be offered to parents and community members.
- MTHS will convey initiatives to parents at open houses and parent conferences.
- MTHS will inform parents of the individual achievement levels of students, via the Community Portal, State Testing Report Cards, individual student Report Cards, and via personal communication.
